

Could you sponsor a nurse today?

As hospice nurses, we need to have many skills, especially as we are frequently caring for people with very complex medical needs. Our care is often seen predominantly as cancer care, but, in reality, we support those with a variety of progressive and life limiting illnesses.

Due to an aging population, there will be far greater demand for our services in the future. By 2040, the number of people dying in England is expected to have increased by 25%. This, in turn, is likely to see the number of people with advanced illnesses and those requiring the support of a hospice at the end of life grow, and we recognise nurses will be vital in meeting this need.

Over the last year, we have cared for 1,203 people living with cancer. We also supported 237 people with neurological conditions, and 432 others with chronic disease such as heart disease. The complexity of our patients' needs is increasing, adding to the growing need for appropriate skill diversity within our nursing teams to ensure our care remains outstanding.




